

# Cookie information

## Linistry Private Limited Company

Linistry Private Limited Company (“Linistry”) uses cookies in connection with its services. Cookies are files that store information on the device and browser of the relevant user. This notice (“Notice”) provides information on the use of cookies.

### Cookie categories

Linistry distinguishes between two categories of cookies: strictly necessary cookies and convenience (functional) cookies.

**Strictly necessary cookies** – These cookies are necessary for the operation of the website and the service, and cannot be turned off in our systems. They are typically set in response to actions you have specifically requested, such as logging in, the secure verification of data, or storing privacy preferences. You can set your browser to block or warn you about these cookies, but then some parts of the website will not work properly.

**Convenience (functional) cookies** – These cookies allow the website to provide enhanced functionality and personalization (e.g. remembering previously entered data or language preference), and allow Linistry to measure website traffic and user behavior for statistical purposes. They may be set by Linistry or by third-party providers whose services we have placed on our pages. They do not directly store personal data, but are based on the unique identification of the browser and the internet-connected device, or on information stored on the user's device. If you do not allow these cookies, some convenience features or traffic measurement may not work properly, although the core functionality of the website will not be affected.

Before placing any cookie that does not fall into the strictly necessary category, Linistry requests the user's prior consent, which the user may change at any time.

The cookies currently used by Linistry are listed in the table below. In addition, Linistry technically records whether the user has previously accepted this Notice.

Category	Cookie name	Type	Function	Lifetime
Strictly necessary	.AspNet.Consent	Linistry system cookie (Microsoft .NET)	Stores whether the user has previously accepted the use of cookies; based on this, it allows or blocks the placement of non-essential cookies.	1 year
Strictly necessary	.AspNetCore.Antiforgery.*	Linistry system cookie (Microsoft .NET)	Protects against CSRF (Cross-Site Request Forgery) attacks: for every data-submitting (POST) request, it verifies that the request genuinely originated from the Linistry interface. Note: as a result of an ongoing technical development (Origin validation), this cookie will be phased out in the future.	Until browser closes

Category	Cookie name	Type	Function	Lifetime
Strictly necessary	Linistry.PhoneValidationCookie	Cookie used by Linistry	Serves a security purpose: stores whether a given phone number has already been successfully verified via SMS code from the given device and browser, so the system does not request repeated verification. The primary purpose of this cookie is the secure verification of the user's identity.	1 year
Strictly necessary	Linistry.EmailValidationCookie	Cookie used by Linistry	On the same principle as the previous cookie, stores the result of the security verification of email addresses.	1 year
Strictly necessary	ai_session	Microsoft (Application Insights) – third-party cookie	Used to identify the current user session for operational monitoring of the application (performance measurement, error detection).	20 minutes
Strictly necessary	ai_user	Microsoft (Application Insights) – third-party cookie	Used to anonymously identify returning users for operational monitoring purposes. Note: the GDPR classification of this cookie is not an unambiguous industry question – under a stricter interpretation it could also be classified as a marketing/tracking cookie.	1 year
Strictly necessary	Google reCAPTCHA v3	Google – third-party security technology	Does not place any cookie on the linistry.com domain; during sign-in and data-verification processes it screens for bots and protects against abuse using JavaScript-based analysis (without cookies). Where enabled, the process depends on this technology for security reasons.	Not cookie-based
Convenience (functional)	Linistry.Culture	Cookie used by Linistry	Stores the language selected by the user so that it does not need to be re-selected on a return visit.	1 year
Convenience (functional)	Linistry.Customer	Cookie used by Linistry	Stores the (encrypted) contact details previously entered in the sign-in form (name, phone number, email address) on the user's	365 days

Convenience (functional)	_ga	Google – third-party cookie	Google Analytics: used to uniquely identify the visitor for statistical purposes.	2 years

Convenience (functional)	_gid	Google – third-party cookie	Used to identify the visitor on a daily basis for statistical purposes.	24 hours
Convenience (functional)	_gat_gtag_<ID>	Google – third-party cookie	Limits the rate of requests sent to Google's servers during high traffic.	1 minute
